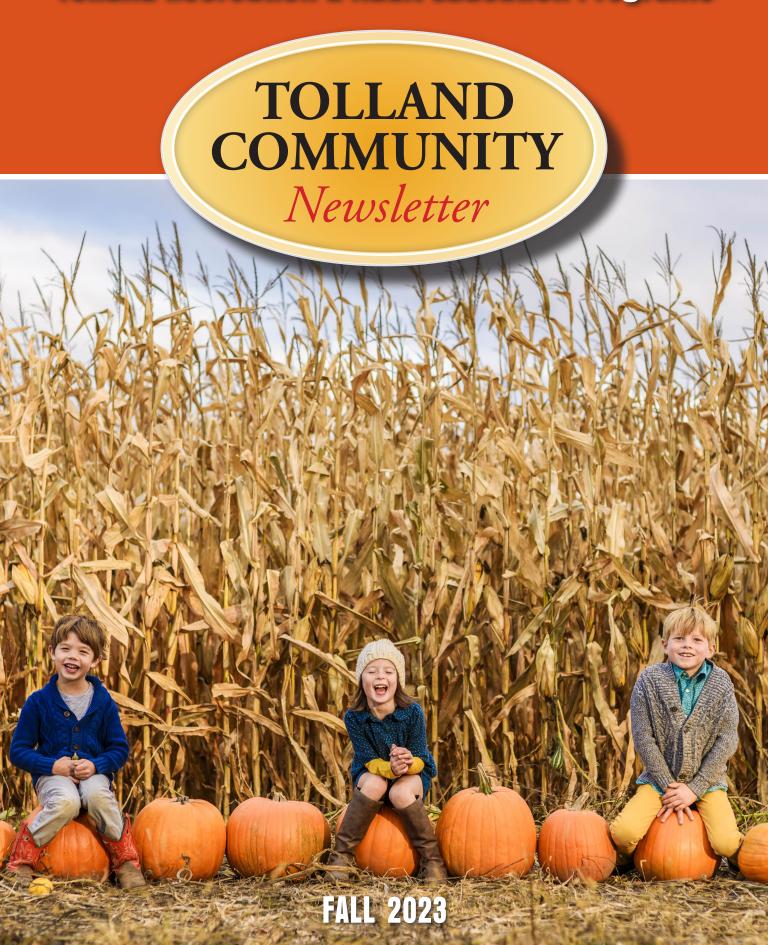

Park Facilities

CRANDALL PARK

64 Cider Mill Road- 350+ acre Town Park containing 3 tennis courts/3 pickle ball courts, a basketball court, softball & baseball fields, a swimming pond, bathrooms, 2.5 miles of marked hiking trails and a picnic area.

PAVILION

Is an open air shelter with picnic table seating for groups of up to 75. Facilities include a large charcoal grill, horseshoe pits and a sand volleyball court. Use of a softball field is possible depending on availability. Rental of the Pavilion does not include beach access. Rental by reservation only through the Recreation Office. "THE LODGE"

124 Cider Mill Road- The Lodge is a year round rental facility available to groups of 100 or less for special events such as weddings, showers, picnics, parties or meetings. Rental rates vary for residents, non-residents, and businesses. Building contains Central Air-conditioning, fireplace, tables & chairs, a warming oven, microwave, and double door fridge.

South River Road - 2 Little League size baseball fields, river access.

HERON COVE PARK

Dial-A-Ride is a transportation program (wheel-chair accessible) for residents who are at least 60 years of age or are disabled. Did you know that many permits can be applied and paid for online? Visit the Building Department webpage and click the Online Permit Center button to start your application. Having proper permits will not only guarantee the work is approved and inspected, but will benefit you if you decide to sell your home. Did you know that homeowner's insurance claims may be denied due to unpermitted home improvements? Our office staff is happy to answer any questions you may have on the permit process.

While you're on the Building Dept. page, check out our many Reference Materials and Links. There is quite a bit of information provided to help you with your home improvement projects, including swimming pools, decks, additions and more.

With the snow and ice, come many problems for our homes. Residents with direct-vent pellet stoves, boilers, water heaters and furnaces should verify that the intake and exhaust vents are not buried by blowing and drifting snow. Direct-vent appliances are those that don't have a typical chimney system; they often have plastic pipes going through the exterior wall, low to the ground. If these pipes are blocked, deadly carbon monoxide can build up in your home. Please don't become a statistic!

Before the snow arrives, consider calling in professional help to address any ice dam issues your roof may have had last year. The root cause is usually a lack of ceiling insulation and/or attic ventilation. We always recommend using a competent, licensed and insured contractor for any home improvement project. A professional contractor will take care of the permit requirements for you and will provide peace of mind knowing that the work is done properly and to current code requirements.

If you have questions for Jim Paquin, the Building Official, he is usually available in the office Mon-Thurs, 8:00-10:00 AM and noon-2:00PM. He is also available Thursday evenings from 6:00-7:30PM.

Winter Parking Bans

Residents are reminded of the winter parking ban in effect from **November 1st through April 15th.** Overnight parking is not allowed on public streets or municipal parking lots between the hours of **midnight and 6:00 AM.** A parking ban may also be declared if a significant snow event is forecast or in progress. For information on whether a parking ban has been declared (beyond the midnight to 6 AM ban) tune to WFSB (CBS), WTNH (ABC) or WVIT (NBC).

Mailboxes

Your mailbox should be in good repair, firmly attached to a solid post and properly placed so no part of it is over the pavement. Your mailbox will have to withstand countless tons of flying snow this winter and may require periodic maintenance. If a mailbox or post is pushed over or damaged as a result of



snow or slush coming off a snowplow, it is considered a winter hazard and the Town will not repair or replace the mailbox or post. The height of the bottom of the mailbox to the street should be between 42-48 inches and the mailbox door should be 6 to 8 inches back from the front face of the curb or road edge.

Garbage & Recycling Tote Placement



Residents are reminded that garbage and recycling totes should be placed within 18 inches of the curb or roadside. Please know that they are to be placed on your property, not in the street. Doing so not only creates a public safety issue but also hinders snow removal operations. The Town is not responsible for damage done to totes by plows.

Portable Basketball Hoops

Portable basketball hoops and similar items should NOT be in the Town Right-of-Way. The Town is not responsible for damage done by plows to such items left in the Town Right-of-Way.

Catch Basins & Storm Inlets

Help minimize street flooding by shoveling snow and ice away from the front of the storm inlet nearest your house. This includes keeping catch basin grates free of leaves and other debris all year long.

Sidewalk Clearing

Per Town Ordinance, it is the responsibility of owners and occupants of buildings and vacant lots to remove snow, sleet and ice from public sidewalks abutting their property within 24



hours after a storm has concluded. Failure to comply with this ordinance may result in a fine. Please remember that the final snowplow pass is not made until after the storm has concluded. Your cooperation in clearing sidewalks is an essential safety measure for pedestrians using the sidewalks.

Fire Hydrants

Owners of property and occupants of buildings that have a fire hydrant are required by Town Ordinance to clear a four-foot area in all directions around the hydrant and a three-foot wide path from the street to the fire hydrant. Failure to comply with this ordinance may result in a fine. The Fire Department counts on hydrants being clear of snow in the event of an emergency.

Christmas Trees

Tolland does not offer curb side pick up of Christmas trees. However, Christmas trees may be dropped off at Crandall's II, near the Lodge driveway, from December 26th through January 26th.

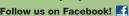

Tolland Fire Department is currently seeking additional Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) to join our volunteer ranks. If you currently hold an EMT license or would like to train to become an EMT please consider volunteering for your community.

- Did you know that the Tolland Fire Department is a combination department?
- A combination department means that both career and volunteer members work together to provide emergency services to the residents, businesses and visitors of Tolland. Our small career staff is on duty Monday through Friday covering the hours of 6:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M. Our volunteer staff covers nights, weekends and major holidays. This type of coverage is a resourceful and cost-effective way to provide top-level services to the Town. Career staff may be called into work to cover major emergencies or during severe weather events. We are grateful that there are still a handful of volunteers that supplement the career staff during the daytime
- · The Department operates two ambulances and responds to emergency calls 24/7/365.
- · We have a flexible duty schedule in which volunteer EMTs can signup for night or weekend shifts. This schedule allows EMTs to fit volunteering into their personal schedules.
- With the increased emergency call volume we are starting to burnout our core membership. If we could recruit a few more people to assist us we can lighten the load of our members, possibly holding onto to these well-trained EMTs and extend their years of service to the community.
- · Additions to the Town's population both residential and commercial over the past years have affected our membership as well. Members have moved away from volunteering for a variety of reasons such as work and family obligations. Bottom line is we need additional volunteer EMTs to keep delivering our high-level of service. We need to plan for Tolland's future, now.
- Volunteer EMTs often reflect on their service to their neighbors and community as a personally fulfilling and extremely rewarding

both career and volunteer, because together they have created a foundation that we continue to build on. We miss those who have moved on and look forward to meeting new people who will help shape our future.

STATE LAW: Move Over or Slow Down for Stopped Emergency Vehicles

STATE LAW

MOVE OVER OR SLOW **DOWN FOR STOPPED EMERGENCY VEHICLES**

Drivers are reminded that they must move over one lane and slow down if they see emergency vehicles and tow trucks stopped on the shoulder of a highway with their lights flashing. If all lanes are full and drivers can't move over, they are required to slow down as they pass the scene. Connecticut passed its Move Over law in 2009, fines for breaking the law start at \$181.

Apartment And Condominium Fire Safety Tips*

*Much of the following information applies to single family residences as well.

Responsibility for the fire safety of your building lies with each and every resident. That's why it is so important that you plan together to keep your building as fire safe as possible and learn

the right thing to do should fire break out. The first place to start is to learn the facts.

- Smoking is the #1 cause of all fatal apartment fires. And, nearly a third of them are caused by someone smoking in bed.
- Most residential fires occur at night when condos and apartments are most heavily populated.

Be Prepared! Plan Ahead for Everyone's Safety!

Meet with your landlord or building manager to devise fire safety plans for your building. As part of your group planning, explore your building. Know every possible exit, including exits from laundry, storage, and recreation rooms. If hallways become smoky in a fire, your memory can help you find a way out. Remember never to use elevators in a fire. Keep exit and stairwell doors closed at all times, but not locked. And, keep exits clear of debris and storage.

Focus on these four key elements in your fire safety plan: Prevention, Detection, Escape Planning and Practice, and **Fire Department Notification.**

1) Prevention

An ounce of prevention can save your life. Prevention is your best insurance against fire. Take these simple fire safety precautions in your own unit to prevent fire from starting.

- Be careful with smoking materials. Keep large ashtrays for smokers and never smoke in bed!
- Keep matches and lighters out of the reach of children. Store matches and lighters in a locked cabinet up high out of the reach of children.
- · Check regularly for electrical hazards, such as worn electrical cords, overloaded extension cords and outlets, and broken appliances.
- Don't store flammable liquids in your home, car, or anywhere else inside your building.
- Don't use balconies, porches, fire escapes or furnace rooms for storage. Fires starting in these areas can burn undetected.

2) Detection

Make sure the fire detection system works! If fire strikes, smoke detectors and fire alarms alert you to a fire right away, so you can get out of the building safely. Remember to test Smoke Detectors and Carbon Monoxide Detectors monthly. Change out any devices that have expired.

- Install smoke detectors on every floor of your own unit. Be sure to place detectors on the ceiling near bedroom areas. This way, if a fire starts while you're asleep, detectors will wake you before it's too
- If you notice that smoke detectors in your own unit or in public hallways are beeping, be sure to have their batteries changed or electrical systems checked. Replace dead batteries immediately.

3) Escape Planning and Practice

In a fire, there is no time to stop and think. You need to know in advance the two quickest safe ways out of your unit and your building. That is why it is critical that you make and practice escape plans.

- Draw up floor plans for each floor with exits clearly marked. Ask your building manager to post the floor plans in high-traffic areas, such as near elevators, exit doors, and foyers. Make a point to review the floor plans now - because in a fire, smoky conditions and urgency can make this impossible.
- Once you've mapped out evacuation procedures, decide on a meeting place outdoors. Go there as soon as you exit the building and stay there. This way, you can keep track of who is out and who may be trapped inside. If you think someone is trapped, tell the fire department - do not go back into the building yourself.
- PRACTICE! Rehearse your escape plans as a group. Appoint a floor captain and hold a fire drill to make sure that everyone knows the right thing to do when the alarm sounds.

4) Fire Department Notification

Call 9-1-1! As a general rule, get out of the building, and then call the fire department from a safe place. When you call, be ready to provide your location and any other information about the fire.

What to Do If Fire Strikes

- Don't rush out of your apartment into the hallway. First, feel the door. If it is hot, use another way out. If the door is cool, leave by the
- · If an announcement can be heard over your building's public address system, listen carefully and follow directions.
- · Never use elevators in a fire! Use the stairs. Close all doors behind you to slow fire spread.
- If your planned escape route becomes smoky, get down on your hands and knees and crawl. Smoke rises, so the cleanest air is near
- Never go back into the building. Go directly to your planned meeting place and stay there. If you think someone is trapped inside, notify the fire department.
- If you can't escape your apartment, stuff wet towel, sheets, or clothes around the door and vents to keep smoke out.
- Call the fire department and tell them where you are. If no smoke is coming into the room you are in, open a window slightly both at the top and the bottom. Stay low and wave a bright cloth, towel, or sheet out the window to signal your location.

Remember, a little bit of planning and awareness can make the difference between safety and disaster... for everyone!

Hot Surfaces

While sunny days can be great for taking pets on walks, it can also pose some dangers. Surfaces such as asphalt and artificial grass can become extremely hot and cause injuries to our pet's paws.



Fire Department/Public Safety

The Journal of the American Medical Association reported that "when the air temperature is 86 degrees, the asphalt temperature registers 135 degrees."They recommend testing the temperature of the pavement by placing the back of your hand on it. If it is too hot for your hand, it is likely too hot for your pet's paws.

Overheating and Dehydration

With warmer weather also comes the risks of your pet suffering from heat exhaustion and heat stroke. Some signs of this include excess saliva, nausea, limited movement, dizziness, seizures and loss of consciousness. Signs of dehydration include too much or too little urine as well as dry eyes, mouth and nose. Immediate care should be provided to your pet upon noticing these symptoms. Keep a watchful eye on your pets and be sure to provide plenty of fresh water and shade if outdoors. Do not hesitate to seek professional medical attention.

Air Quality

In addition to extreme hot/cold temperatures, air quality can also affect our pets. Smog, humidity and haze from wildfires can affect the quality of air we breathe. If you plan on taking your pet for a walk, it might be helpful to check the Air Quality Index to make sure it will be comfortable for both you and your pet.

Pets in Vehicles

It is never a good idea to leave a pet inside a vehicle by themselves, especially on hot days. The American Veterinary Medical Association mentions that "Even on a 70-degree day, that's 110 degree inside your vehicle!" Even on cloudy days, the temperature inside a vehicle can be too dangerous for people and pets.



Whether long trips or short trips around town, when traveling with your pet consider placing them inside a properly secured carrier or use a specially-designed pet seatbelt (harness/tether) to ensure that they are safe and secure inside the vehicle. Having your pet loose isn't safe for the driver or your pet. In the unfortunate event of an accident taking these small steps can protect your beloved pet and increase their chance of survival.

Don't let your dog ride with their head out the window!

While this makes some dogs happy, and it's cute to see, it subjects your pet to real risks. Debris kicked up from the road can strike and injure your faithful friend. Microscopic particles in the air can cause discomfort to their eyes and nose. In the case of an



accident or if the driver has to make a sudden maneuver to avoid a collision, your pet could be ejected from the vehicle. For their benefit think safety first when traveling with your furry friends.
