FREE Residential Electronics Recycling Collection

The Town of Tolland in cooperation with Take 2, Inc. will be

hosting a **FREE** Residential Electronics Recycling Collection event at **Tolland High School** located at **1 Eagle Hill**. Residents are encouraged to bring their unwanted electronics to the drive up/drive through electronics collection event on **Saturday**, **April 29**, **2023** between **8 AM and 12 noon**.

Due to current COVID-19 concerns, Take 2, Inc. has implemented the following changes in their event procedures for the safety staff, residents and customers. All Take 2, Inc. personnel will wear masks & gloves at all times. Staff is currently unable to retrieve items from the main cabins of vehicles. They ask instead that residents place items for recycling in vehicle trunks or pickup truck beds. It is important that items are in easily accessible areas, separate from the cabin of the vehicle to ensure social distancing while removing. Items will be removed and placed on the ground in staging areas by Take 2, Inc. staff. Items will be packaged & loaded by Take 2, Inc. onto trucks.

Accepted materials include, but are not limited to: Computers, Laptops, Printers, Fax Machines, Monitors, TVs, Cell Phones, Tablets, Video Games, game consoles, VCR/DVD Machines, Remotes, Keyboards, Small Appliances, Light Bulbs and Batteries. Unaccepted materials include: smoke detectors, propane tanks, ballasts, paint, household hazardous waste and appliances containing freon, i.e. air conditioners, refrigerators, dehumidifiers.

CRANDALL PARK

64 Cider Mill Road- 350+ acre Town Park containing 3 tennis courts/3 pickle ball courts, a basketball court, softball & baseball fields, a swimming pond, bathrooms, 2.5 miles of marked hiking trails and a picnic area.

PAVILION

Is an open air shelter with picnic table seating for groups of up to 75. Facilities include a large charcoal grill, horseshoe pits and a sand volleyball court. Use of a softball field is possible depending on availability. Rental of the Pavilion does not include beach access. Rental by reservation only through the Recreation Office. "THE LODGE"

124 Cider Mill Road- The Lodge is a year round rental facility available to groups of 100 or less for special events such as weddings, showers, picnics, parties or meetings. Rental rates vary for residents, non-residents, and businesses. Building contains Central Air-conditioning, fireplace, tables & chairs, a warming oven, microwave, and double door fridge.

June is Dog Licensing Month!



CT law requires that all dogs six months of age or older be licensed during the month of June. The cost is \$8.00 for altered dogs and \$19.00 for unaltered dogs. A one dollar late fee per dog will be charged each month for those who are late.

All dogs must have proof of a current rabies vaccination on file. Postcard reminders

will be mailed the last week of May. Please check the rabies expiration date printed on the postcard. Any dog whose expiration date is 6/30/2023 or before will have to provide a new rabies certificate in order to license in June. When licensing by mail, make checks payable to "Town of Tolland" and include a self-addressed, stamped envelope for the return of your tags and paperwork. Mail it to: Kathleen Pagan, Town Clerk, 21 Tolland Green, Tolland, CT 06084.

You can also renew your current dog license(s) online using your credit/debit card. There is a \$1.75 convenience fee added to allow for this online service. A valid rabies certificate must already be on file. You will need to enter your dog's current tag number, which is printed on your reminder postcard. Your dog's new tags will be mailed to you.

If you no longer own your licensed dog, please notify us at 860-871-3630 or email us at *kpagan@tolland.org* so that we can remove the record.

Remember: Per CT State Statute, the fine for having an unlicensed dog is \$75.00.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we are asking all residents to continue to license their dogs by mail, by utilizing the drop box located in parking lot A on Old Post Road, or by renewing your eligible licenses online.

The emergency notification system is a user friendly platform which will allow Tolland residents to share crime tips in a two-way communication setting with the Tolland Resident Troopers Office. Users will receive real time updates of incidents occurring within our Town such as motor vehicle accidents, road closures, crime bulletins, public events, and critical incidents. Information broadcasted on Atlas One by the Tolland Resident Troopers will be received by users in real time, and will be updated as incidents are investigated and as information is developed. Renter's Rebate

Tolland Human Services will be accepting Renter's Rebate applications from April 1, 2023 to September 28, 2023. This income-based program provides a one-time payment to renters based on the rent and utilities paid in 2022. Recipient or spouse must be 65 years of age or older, or be 50 years of age or older and the surviving spouse of a renter who at the time of the renter's death had qualified and was entitled to tax relief provided such spouse was domiciled with such renter at the time of the renters death, or 18 years of age or older and eligible to receive Social Security Disability benefits and must meet a one year state residency requirement.

Did you know that many permits can be applied and paid for online? From the homepage of TollandCT. gov, click on the Building Department Online Permitting button. While you're on the Building Dept. page, please browse through our many informative handouts. There quite a bit of information regarding swimming pools, decks, additions and the permit application process in general. Remember to schedule a final inspection appointment to properly close out your permit. Open Building Permits will impede the sale of your home and may give cause to an insurance company to deny a claim for fire or personal injury.

Now that warmer weather is finally here, many of you may be thinking of installing a swimming pool. A building permit is required for all inground pools and any above-ground pools that are more than 24 inches deep. Building codes have changed a bit and we are here to offer guidance for a code-compliant installation. Items commonly missed by installers are proper bonding of the water and perimeter area; not having a floating pool alarm; not having a proper fence or gate and running the pump off of an extension cord instead of permanent wiring.

Another thing that we see many people doing is running a window

air conditioner off an undersized extension cord. A proper air conditioner cord is usually of 14 gauge wire, has a three-prong plug and is no longer than six feet long. A utility-grade cord may not only damage the air conditioner, but will likely begin to melt and may cause a fire well before the circuit breaker trips. Do yourself a favor and visit a knowledgeable, well-stocked hardware store for assistance in selecting a proper cord.

The Building Official, James Paquin is typically available in the office to answer questions from 8:00-10:00 AM and Noon-2:00 PM, plus 6:00-7:30 PM on Thursdays.

Children and Fire

Children "playing" with or starting fires is dangerous and costly. Each year these fires cause hundreds of injuries, millions of dollars in damage, and are most likely to kill young children under the age of 5.

Some children play with fire out of curiosity, boredom, or peer pressure, not realizing its danger. But other children misuse fire because they are struggling with problems or emotions. Without proper intervention and instruction, children who misuse fire will very likely do it again. However, if punishment is the only intervention strategy used, it could actually contribute to the problem. What can you do?

Follow these tips to keep your family safe:

- Keep matches and lighters out of the reach of children, up high, preferably in a locked cabinet.
- Closely supervise children, making sure that they are kept away from other fire sources, including lit candles, cigarettes, bonfires, and stoves.
- It is natural for young children to be curious and ask questions about fire, play with fire trucks, or pretend to cook. Use these opportunities to teach them about fire safety.
- Explain that fire moves very fast and can hurt as soon as it touches them. Tell them that this is why matches and lighters are tools for adults only.
- Teach young children to never touch matches or lighters. They must go tell a grown-up when matches or lighters are found.
- Establish clear rules and consequences about unsupervised and unauthorized uses of fire.
- Be a good example! Always use fire sources matches, lighters, candles, fireplaces, and campfires in a safe manner. Never treat them as toys, or children may imitate you.
- Talk with children about what their friends or other children are doing with fire. What are they seeing online in video games, on TV,in movies, and on social media? Teach them specific ways to resist the peer pressure to misuse fire.
- Give praise for showing respect and age-appropriate responsible behavior toward fire.

Important!

Understand that children and fire are a **deadly combination**. If you suspect a child is unusually interested in fire or is setting fires, take immediate action. Follow these safety tips. Contact your local fire department, school, burn center, or counseling agency to get helpfrom specially trained experts. All children are at risk for using fire unsafely. Many fires happen simply because matches and lighters are left within a child's reach.

Grilling Safety Tips

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- Approximately 1 of every 5 grill fires, involved grills which had not been cleaned. To prevent fires and injuries, keep grills clean! Roughly, half of the injuries involving grills are thermal burns.

PROPANE GRILLS:

- The grill should be placed at least 10 feet away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.

- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- · Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.
- Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year.
 - Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do not move the grill.
- If the flame goes out, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 5 minutes before re-lighting it.

CHARCOAL GRILLS:

There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use.

- Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord rated for outdoor use.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

Car Fire Safety

Cars can catch fire for many reasons. Mechanical or electrical issues are the most common cause. Most car fluids are flammable. Heat and electrical sparks plus leaking fluid are all it takes to start a car fire. If you see smoke or flames or smell burning rubber or plastic, respond immediately.

WHAT TO DO IF YOUR CARIS ON FIRE:

- Pull over as quickly as it is safe to do so, be sure to use your signal as you make your way to a safe location off the road such as the breakdown lane or rest stop.
- Once you have stopped, TURN OFF the engine.
- GET everyone out of the car. Never return to a burning car for anything.
- MOVE everyone at least 100 feet from the burning car and well away from traffic.
- CALL 9-1-1.

KNOW THE DANGER SIGNS:

- Cracked or loose wiring or electrical problems, including a fuse that blows more than once
- · Oil or fluid leaks
- · Oil cap not on securely
- Rapid changes in fuel or fluid level, or engine temperature.

A car can also catch fire as the result of a bad crash, however most crashes do NOT result in fire. In the event of a crash, call 9-1-1. If there is no sign of fire, wait for emergency assistance to help any

- Volunteer EMTs often reflect on their service to their neighbors and community as a personally fulfilling and extremely rewarding experience.
- With the increased emergency call volume we are starting to burnout our core membership. If we could recruit a few more people to assist us we can lighten the load of our members, possibly holding onto to these well-trained EMTs and extend their years of service to the community.
- Additions to the Town's population both residential and commercial over the past years have affected our membership as well. Members have moved away from volunteering for a variety of reasons such as work and family obligations. Bottom line is we need additional volunteer EMTs to keep delivering our high-level of service.

We would like to thank all of our past and present members, both career and volunteer, because together they have created a foundation that we continue to build on. We miss those who have moved on and look forward to meeting new people who will help shape our future.

STATE LAW: Move Over or Slow Down for Stopped Emergency Vehicles

Flashing red, blue and yellow lights are a familiar sight on highways and Emergency Responders (Police, Fire and Tow Truck Operators) are asking motorists to "Move Over" and "Slow Down" to provide enough room for them to safely do their jobs. When lights are flashing, Emergency Responders are working in extremely hazardous and sometimes stressful conditions using very limited space. Close calls are beginning to become the norm as motorists speed by emergency scenes. A split second could mean the difference in everyone going home safely or a responder being injured or killed.

Drivers are reminded that they must move over one lane and slow down if they see emergency vehicles and tow trucks stopped on the shoulder of a highway with their lights flashing. If all lanes are full and drivers can't move over, they are required to slow down as they pass the scene. Connecticut passed its Move Over law (C.G.S. §14-238b) in 2009, fines for breaking the law start at \$181.

Driveway Accessibility

As you know Tolland Fire Department's number one priority is the safety of our residents and our ability to respond to emergency calls for service. While that statement is true, we are also concerned for the safety of our staff and Fire Department equipment.

Lately, we are noticing a disturbing trend where driveways to properties have become narrow, littered with overhanging trees, limbs, branches and the like. Clearance problems may not be so evident to you, however they are of great concern to the Department. Since our apparatus is larger than most personal vehicles, extra clearance is needed to accommodate the larger size of a fire truck or ambulance to prevent scratches or damage to the apparatus. Additionally low hanging vegetation could impact your service wires, possibly causing damage to your connection. Low hanging wires may also impede emergency access.

We would appeal to our residents to please evaluate driveway access to their property and complete the necessary maintenance, so that it can easily accommodate larger vehicles. Also, please re-evaluate access often throughout the year, especially after strong storms. Your cooperation will help ensure we can get to you in your time of need safely and quickly, without damaging our equipment or your trees, bushes, etc. Being vigilant will benefit everyone.

Emergency Medical Information Pouches

Our brightly-colored Personal Emergency Medical form provides an opportunity for you to list your name, address, medications, medical conditions, allergies and insurance information in one convenient place. Completed forms are meant to be kept in your home in a conspicuous place, such as on a front table or refrigerator. First Responders are trained to look for these brightly-colored informational forms when responding to your home in an emergency.

Magnetic pouches containing these free brightly-colored forms are

Would you or a loved one in Tolland require special assistance to evacuate your home during a town-wide emergency? If so, you may want to consider being place on Tolland Emergency Management's Special Needs list.

Residents who may be oxygen dependent, may need assistance with a wheelchair or walker, have vision or hearing impairment or another special circumstance and would require assistance evacuating their home during an emergency should consider registering. Registration requires completing our downloadable "Special Needs Registration" form which is available on our website. When the Power Goes Out, Call It In!

Have you ever wondered whether or not you should call in a power outage? Have you thought that your neighbor must have called it in? If you're out of power, you should report the outage directly to Eversource, do NOT assume someone else has already reported the outage.

Animal Control Background



Bats are among the world's most fascinating, beneficial and likable animals, yet people often fear and misunderstand them. They are the only mammals capable of true flight. There are over 1,300 different species of bats in the world – nine different species of bats can be found in Connecticut, and all but one of them (the big brown bat) are on Connecticut's List of Endangered, Threatened and Special Concern Species.

Natural History of Bats

Bats are furred, warm-blooded mammals with body lengths of 3 to 6 inches on average and wingspans ranging from 8 to 16 inches. The bones in a bat's wing are similar to those in human arms and hands. The fingers are extended and connected by leathery, elastic skin that grows from the sides of a bat's body. The thumbs are free from the wing membrane and have claws for grasping.

Bats have good eyesight and rely on vision for long-distance orientation. For short-distance navigation and catching food at night, they use echolocation. This sonar system helps bats, like dolphins, locate targets and background objects from the echoes of ultrasonic pulses. The tempo of these pulses are slow when a bat is foraging and guicken as the bat pursues and captures an insect. Detection, pursuit, and capture of an insect take about one second.

Connecticut's bats are primarily insect eaters. An exception is the hoary bat, which also eats other bats, namely the tri-colored bat. Bats are mostly nocturnal and almost always feed "on the wing." They use their wings, the skin around their tails, and their mouths to catch insects in flight. Bats are the only major predators of night-flying insects, making them beneficial in several ways. They consume many agricultural pests, such as cutworm and corn borer moths, potato beetles, and grasshoppers. Mosquitoes and similar human pests are eliminated much more efficiently by bats than by birds or expensive bug zappers.

Interesting Facts

- In general, bats are not dangerous. Like any other mammal, they can carry rabies, although less than one percent of all bats are infected with the virus. More people die annually from dog attacks, bee stings, lightning, and household accidents than from battransmitted rabies.
- Bats are not flying mice. They are the only mammal capable of true flight and are more closely related to primates (and people) than to rodents.
- Bats do not get caught in people's hair. They are adept fliers and rely on sensitive sonar (echolocation) to navigate night skies. Bats that swoop near people are after insects like mosquitoes and
- Bats are not blind. They have good eyesight, but rely on echolocation to master night flight.
- Bats are not filthy or covered with parasites. Clean wings are essential for executing intricate flight patterns, so bats spend great amounts of time grooming themselves.
- · Worldwide there over 1,300 kinds of bats; Connecticut has only nine native species.
- Only 3 species of bats feed on animal blood. These vampire bats prefer to drink cattle or bird blood and are only found in Latin
- The smallest bat is the size of a small mouse; the largest, a fruit eater, has a 6-foot wingspan.
- A single little brown bat can eat 1,200 mosquitoes and night-flying insects in an hour.
- Bats have varied diets: 70 percent eat insects; many tropical species eat fruit or drink flower nectar; and some bats even catch frogs and


