FREE Residential Electronics Recycling Collection

The Town of Tolland in cooperation with Take 2, Inc. will be hosting a FREE Residential Electronics Recycling Collection event at Tolland High School located at 1 Eagle Hill. Residents are encouraged to bring their unwanted electronics to the drive up/drive through electronics collection event on **Saturday, April 26, 2025** between 8 AM and 12 noon.

Accepted materials include, but are not limited to: Computers, Laptops, Printers, Fax Machines, Monitors, TVs, Cell Phones,

Tablets, Video Games, game consoles, VCR/DVD Machines, Remotes, Keyboards, Small Appliances, Light Bulbs and Batteries. Unaccepted materials include: smoke detectors, propane tanks, ballasts, paint, household hazardous waste and appliances containing freon, i.e. air conditioners, refrigerators, dehumidifiers.

Town Wide Shredding Event

The Town of Tolland will host a **free** paper-shredding event on Saturday, April 26, 2025. The event will take place from 9:00am – 12:00pm at Tolland High School in the rear parking lot. (This event is in conjunction with our Electronics Recycling Event which will be held in the front parking lot.) This event allows residents to bring paper documents for a free and safe paper shredding with proof of residency. Accepted documents will be personal, residential documents only. Commercial or business documents will not be accepted.

- Limit of (3) bags or boxes.
- No junk mail, magazines, books, cards, envelopes, metal ring binders, school papers. Sensitive documents only.
- Non-sensitive documents may be routinely recycled.
- Documents which require shredding should be in secure bags or boxes which can support the weight of the material, be easily accessed within your vehicle for unloading by staff.
- Resident verification (driver's license) required.
- Container(s) or receptacle(s) used to deliver documents to be shredded will not be returned.

Park Facilities



Assessor's Office - Tax Relief Programs

The Town of Tolland Offers Tax Relief Programs

See if you qualify! There are three separate programs available, and if qualified, you may apply for each program or the ones that best suit your needs. The Tolland Assessor's office is currently accepting applications for the tax relief programs. The filing period is February 1, 2025 through May 15, 2025. Tolland residency is required and all applications must be accompanied with proof of 2024 income. Homestead exemptions or financial assistance in another town or state will disqualify a homeowner for these programs. To find out more, check out the Tax Relief Programs page on the assessor's tab of the town website.

- 1) Homeowner Aid for the Elderly and Disabled Program (also known as the Circuit Breaker) is a State program which requires homeowners to be 65 years of age as of December 31, 2024, or be 50 years of age or over and the surviving spouse of a homeowner who at the time of death had qualified for and was entitled to tax relief, or be eligible to receive permanent total disability benefits under Social Security. You must also have been a resident of Connecticut for at least one year. Your 2024 gross income, including the non-taxable portion of Social Security, cannot exceed \$55,100 if married or \$45,200 if unmarried.
- 2) Tax Deferral for Senior Citizens (known as local Ordinance 25) is a local tax deferment program. This program defers a portion of property taxes for low income or totally disabled homeowners while they own their property. When the property is sold or a use change occurs, all deferred or back taxes are due with interest. The maximum 2024 total household income cannot exceed \$78,000 for this program. You must be over 65 years of age as of December 31, 2024 or eligible to receive permanent total disability benefits under Social Security.
- 3) Local Tax Relief Program for Permanently Disabled and Senior Residents (know as local Ordinance 60) Qualifying homeowners must have resided and paid taxes on the property since July 1, 2024 or earlier and at least one of the homeowners must be 65 years of age by December 31, 2024 or eligible to receive permanent total disability benefits of the surviving spouse of the homeowner who at the time of death qualified for this program. The maximum 2024 total household income cannot exceed \$78,000 for this program and total household assets (excluding your primary home) cannot exceed \$780,000.

Tolland Revaluation

The Town of Tolland has completed the mandatory revaluation for the 2024 grand list. Inspections of all properties have been completed, assessment notices have been mailed and all informal hearings have been

completed. Unlike the previous two revaluations, many assessments increased significantly because of the crazy real estate market.

The town is anticipating to able to offset this sticker shock by adopting a lower mill rate. The budget process continues throughout the spring and that is your opportunity to bring questions to the town manager and the finance department. It is the referendum and budget process that determines the mill rate. Once the new mill rate is approved and adopted, the upcoming taxes can be calculated. Be active, be aware and learn about the process. Most importantly, don't forget to vote!

Have you gotten rid of your motor vehicle?

DMV does not notify us of any changes in ownership or registration status after each October 1st. It is your responsibility to communicate with us to see if an adjustment is due. Did you move to another town in Connecticut? The motor vehicle tax bill is payable to the town where you resided on October 1st. To find out more, check out the Motor Vehicle Information page on the assessor's tab of the town website.

Business Owners:

While it seems far away right now, September is the time for personal property declarations to be sent. If you own or operate a business in Tolland be sure to return the required declaration by the deadline to avoid a penalty. If you are no longer operating a business, please supply the office with the appropriate documents or visit the Personal Property Information page on the assessor's tab of the town website.

Veterans: Have you filed your discharge papers?

September 30th is the deadline to present a certified copy of your discharge papers to the Town Clerk to be considered for the following assessment year. If a Veteran's Administration disability is being awarded please bring a copy of the current award letter, stating the percentage of disability and the award date, to the assessor's office as this may change the amount of exemption. In order to qualify for the proposed???? new legislation a disability must awarded at 100% and be characterized as a "service-connected permanent and total" disability. In addition to the VA service-connected permanent and total permanent disability rating, the dwelling must be the primary and current residence of the veteran to receive this exemption. Town Clerk - June is Dog Licensing Month

June is Dog Licensing Month!

CT law requires that all dogs six months of age or older be licensed during the month of June. The cost is \$8.00 for altered dogs and \$19.00 for unaltered dogs. A one dollar late fee per dog will be charged each month for those who are late.

All dogs must have proof of a current rabies vaccination on file. Postcard reminders will be mailed the last week of May. Please check the rabies expiration date printed on the postcard. Any dog whose expiration date is 6/1/2025 or before will have to provide a new rabies certificate in order to license in June. When licensing by mail, make checks payable to "Town of

When licensing by mail, make checks payable to "Town of Tolland" and include a self-addressed, stamped envelope for the return of your tags and paperwork. Mail it to: Kathleen Pagan, Town Clerk, 21 Tolland Green, Tolland, CT 06084.

You can also renew your current dog license(s) online using your credit/debit card. There is a \$1.75 convenience fee added

to allow for this online service. A valid rabies certificate must already be on file. You will need to enter your dog's current tag number, which is printed on your reminder postcard. Your dog's new tags will be mailed to you.

Did you know that many permits can be applied and paid for

online? Visit the Building Department webpage and click the 'Forms & Permits" button to start your application. Having proper permits will not only guarantee the work is approved and inspected, but will benefit you if you decide to sell your home. Did you know homeowner's insurance claims may be denied due to unpermitted home improvements? Our office staff is happy to answer any questions you may have on the permit process.

Spring brings many outdoor projects to the forefront. It is

likely that you may want to power-wash your home, repair a fence, replace a few shingles, paint the house or stain a deck. While none of the above home-maintenance items require a permit, it is highly recommended that you still hire licensed and insured contractors. You should also always get a written proposal from the contractor and ask for references. Never pay in-full for a job in advance; a partial deposit is common and fair to everyone involved.

Now that warmer weather will be arriving soon, many of you may be thinking of installing a swimming pool. A building permit is required for all in-ground pools and any above-ground pools that are more than 24 inches deep, including the inflat-

able style pools. Building codes have changed a bit and we are here to offer guidance for a code-compliant installation. Items

commonly missed by installers are proper bonding of the water and perimeter area; not having a floating pool alarm; not having a proper fence or gate and running the pump off of an extension cord instead of permanent wiring.

regulations, or have general inquired, we are pleased to offer our support.



As much as our drivers try not to do any damage while plowing the snow from the streets, it does sometimes happen.



Fire Department

Submitted by the Office of the Fire Marshal: Hoarding and Fire: Reducing the Risk

Do you have a person in your life who may be a hoarder? Hoarding is a condition where a person has persistent difficulty discarding personal possessions. The large amount of possessions fill the home and prevent the normal use of the space. Living space becomes cluttered. It may be unusable. Hoarding brings distress and emotional health concerns.

Why Hoarding Increases Fire Risks

- · Cooking is unsafe if flammable items are close to the stove or
- Heating units may be too close to things that can burn. They might also be placed on unstable surfaces. If a heater tips over into a pile, it can cause a fire.
- Electrical wiring may be old or worn from the weight of piles. Pests could chew on wires. Damaged wires can start fires.
- Open flames from smoking materials or candles in a home with excess clutter are very dangerous.
- Blocked pathways and exits may hinder escape from a fire.

How Hoarding Impacts First Responders

- Hoarding puts first responders in harm's way.
- Firefighters cannot move swiftly through a home filled with clutter.
- Responders can be trapped in a home when exits are blocked. They can be injured by objects falling from piles.
- The weight of the stored items, especially if water is added to put out a fire, can lead to building collapse.
- Fighting fires is very risky in a hoarding home. It is hard to enter the home to provide medical care. The clutter impedes the search and rescue of people and pets.

How Can You Help Reduce the Risk of Fire Injury?

- · When talking to a person who hoards, focus on safety rather than the clutter. Be empathetic. Match the person's language. If they call it hoarding, then you can call it hoarding.
- Help the residents make a home safety and escape plan. Stress the importance of clear pathways and exits. Practice the plan often. Exit routes may change as new items are brought into the home.
- Install working smoke alarms in the home. Test them at least



once a month.

Reach out to community resources. Talk to members of the fire department to alert them of your concerns. They may be able to connect you with members of a hoarding task force for additional help

From the Office of the Fire Marshal: **Outdoor Grilling Safety**

There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food. But, a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. They can be very hot, causing burn injuries. Follow these simple tips and you will be on the way to safe grilling.

SAFETY TIPS:

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings, structures, trees and out from under eaves and overhanging branches
- · Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill
- · Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grill and from the trays below the grill
- Never leave your grill unattended
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it

PROPANE GRILLS:

- Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do not move the grill.
- If the flame goes out, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 5 minutes before re-lighting it.

CHARCOAL GRILLS:

- There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel. If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord rated specifically for outdoor use.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

Welcome Spring and Summer: With warmer weather in the air, Tolland Animal Control would like to remind our dog owners of some very important topics:

- · We welcome dog owners to enjoy our town parks and trails, however dogs MUST be leashed at all times
- You MUST pick up after your dog.
- Our parks and trail systems are for all residents to enjoy. Please be courteous, because we are all sharing the same paths and
- Remember, animals are NOT permitted on playgrounds, ball fields, tennis/pickleball/basketball courts or school running tracks.

Hot Weather Reminders

Animal Control Officers would like to remind people who are traveling with their pets even on short trips around town, to be aware of the heat, humidity and temperatures. It only takes minutes for a vehicle which is parked in the sun to climb to extreme temperatures. Even when the outside temperature is only in the 60's, the temperature inside a vehicle can climb into the 'danger zone' after only a short period of time. Parking the vehicle in the shade and rolling down the window doesn't guarantee protection from heatstroke and suffocation. Pet owners should be aware that tragedy can happen when you least expect it.

This chart depicts how quickly temperatures can rise inside a parked car!

Dogs which are left outdoors during the summer months must have shelter from the sun and rain, and must have fresh clean water available to them at all times. If you must keep your dog outdoors, it is recommended that the dog be secured in a covered kennel rather than chained or tied where the dog can become entangled and injure their legs, trachea or even be strangled.

Annual Unlicensed Dog Survey

Pursuant to the Regulations of State Agencies Section 22-349-1, Tolland Animal Control Officers will conduct an annual Unlicensed Dog survey in town. Officers will be contacting residents at random, beginning March 15, 2025 and conclude by May 31, 2025.

Reminder to dog owners: Dogs age six months and older are required to be licensed. Licenses are available in the Town Clerk's Office located in Town Hall during regular business hours. Hours are Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, Thursday 8:00 AM to 7:30 PM, Friday closed. Proof of current rabies vaccination is required. All dog licenses purchased in 2024 must be renewed in June 2025. If you no longer own or the dog is deceased, please contact 860-871-3676 to update our licensing database or send an email to animalcontrol@tolland.org including the owner's name, address and the dog's name. Be sure to include why the dog isn't licensed.

IMPORTANT: Please take note that by failing to license your dog(s) with the town each year, you are also in violation of Connecticut State Statute §22-338. This violation carries an additional penalty of \$75.00 for each unlicensed dog owned or kept by you, should an infraction ticket is issued. Animal Control Officers are required to issue infraction tickets to those in violation of the State statute. If you have any questions regarding licensing, please contact our office at 860-871-3676.

Avian Influenza "Bird Flu"

With a recent increase in news coverage regarding Avian Influenza, Tolland Animal Control would like to pass along some information from the CT Department of Agriculture. This information is not meant to cause fear, but rather inform our community about the virus.

Avian Influenza, commonly referred to as "Bird Flu" is a naturally occurring viral disease in birds. Bird flu is often found in migratory birds and can be passed to domestic poultry directly or indirectly through the environment. There are two different classification of Avian Influenza, either Highly Pathogenic or Low Pathogenic depending on how lethal the virus is. Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI), also referred to as H5N1 can be found among domestic poultry and wild birds. This strain has a high mortality rate, especially among domestic poultry. Connecticut has three state agencies that monitor for H5N1 including the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP), the Department of Agriculture (DoAg) and the Department of Public Health (DPH.)

Is My Car Seat Still Safe After a Crash?

The unthinkable has happened. You were traveling along with the kids in the back and got into a car crash. Thankfully, there were no injuries... except for your vehicle. Are the car seats still safe to use? There are no laws regarding when a car seat should be discarded in this scenario, but the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) has put forth a set of guidelines to follow.

NHTSA recommends that car seats be replaced following a moderate to severe crash in order to ensure a continued high level of crash protection for child passengers. Car seats do not automatically need to be replaced following a minor crash.

What defines a minor crash?

A minor crash is one in which ALL of the following apply:

- 1. The vehicle was able to be driven away from the crash site.
- 2. The vehicle door nearest the car seat was not damaged.
- 3. None of the passengers in the vehicle sustained any injuries in the crash.
- 4. If the vehicle has airbags, the air bags did not deploy during the crash; and
- 5. There is no visible damage to the car seat. (Including under the padding)

If the crash is minor, you may consider keeping your seat, but remember to ALWAYS follow your manufacturer's instructions first. Some manufacturers state that the seat must not be used after any crash. Some follow the NHTSA guidelines. Others have their own specific guidelines. If you are unsure, contact the manufacturer directly. Lastly, this all applies whether your child was in the seat or not. What is important is that the seat (or base) was in the vehicle during a crash.

The good news is that some insurance companies may reimburse for the loss of a car seat in a crash. Make sure you tell them the make and model when you make your claim. If they are unsure as to whether or not it is covered, show them the manufacturer's instructions that say it must be replaced.

"Beat the Heat, Check the Backseat!"

One of the biggest weather-related risks during the summer months is the possibility of a child dying in a vehicle from heat stroke. The temperature inside a vehicle can rise 20 degrees in as little as 10 minutes, and 50 degrees in an hour. This can cause hyperthermia (heat stroke) in literally a matter of minutes, particularly in children, whose body temperatures warm at a rate 3 to 5 times faster than an adult's. These tragic deaths are preventable.

To help bring awareness to this issue, the NWS is using the slogan "Beat the Heat...Check the Backseat" to remind people to be sure they remember small children who may be in a car seat, and to never leave children unattended in a vehicle, even for a few moments.

Some basic safety recommendations:

- · NEVER LEAVE A CHILD UNATTENDED IN A VEHICLE. NOT **EVEN FOR A MINUTE!**
- IF YOU SEE A CHILD UNATTENDED IN A HOT VEHICLE CALL 9-1-1.
- Be sure that all occupants leave the vehicle when unloading. Don't overlook sleeping babies.
- Always lock your car and ensure children do not have access to keys or remote entry devices.
- Teach your children that vehicles are never to be used as a play area.
- IF A CHILD IS MISSING, ALWAYS CHECK THE POOL FIRST, AND THEN THE CAR, INCLUDING THE TRUNK.
- Keep a stuffed animal in the carseat and when the child is put in the seat place the animal in the front with the driver. Or place your phone, purse or briefcase in the back seat as a reminder that you have your child in the car.
- Make "look before you leave" a routine whenever you get out of the car.
- · Have a plan that your childcare provider will call you if your child does not show up for school.
- Remember that pets should also never be left in a vehicle during the summer months.

CONNECTICUT'S MOVE OVER LAW

Slow down and move over, or "Move Over" laws, require that when drivers approach an emergency vehicle stopped on the side of the road, they immediately slow down below the posted speed limit. If there is another lane to safely move into, do that. Connecticut actually has a stronger Move Over law as it applies to ALL vehicles stopped with flashing or hazard lights, including emergency vehicles, passenger cars, tow trucks, work trucks, etc. The Connecticut General Assembly recently expanded this requirement to emergency vehicles on a one lane road. To comply with the law, drivers should slow down below the speed limit and proceed only if it is safe to do so. Failing to follow Connecticut's "Move Over" law can result in penalties. Violating this law is an infraction. However, if it results in the injury of emergency personnel, the driver can be fined up to \$2,500. If it results in a fatality, the driver can be fined up to \$10,000 and potentially face criminal charges.



Is Your Street Number Visible from the Road?

Residents and Business Owners are asked to please check their street address numbers. Can they be seen from the road? Are they faded, too small, overgrown or missing? If so, please update your numbers so that they are visible from both directions. The Fire Department offers blue reflective street address signs for \$16. Tolland Fire Department is currently seeking additional Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) to join our volunteer ranks. If you currently hold an EMT license or would like to train to become an EMT please consider volunteering for your community.

- Did you know that the Tolland Fire Department is a combination department?
 - A combination department means that both career and volunteer members work together to provide emergency services to the residents, businesses and visitors of Tolland. Our small career staff is on duty Monday through Friday covering the hours of 6:00am to 6:00pm. Our volunteer staff covers nights, weekends and major holidays. This type of coverage is a resourceful and cost-effective way to provide top-level services to the Town. Career staff may be called into work to cover major emergencies or during severe weather events. We are grateful that there are still a handful of volunteers that supplement the career staff during the daytime hours.
- The Department operates two ambulances and responds to emergency calls 24/7/365.

- We have a flexible duty schedule in which volunteer EMTs can sign-up for night or weekend shifts. This schedule allows EMTs to fit volunteering into their personal schedules.
- With the increased emergency call volume we are starting to burn-out our core membership. If we could recruit a few more people to assist us we can lighten the load of our members, possibly holding onto to these well-trained EMTs and extend their years of service to the community.
- Additions to the Town's population both residential and commercial over the past years have affected our membership as well. Members have moved away from volunteering for a variety of reasons such as work and family obligations. Bottom line is we need additional volunteer EMTs to keep delivering our high-level of service. We need to plan for Tolland's future, now.
- Volunteer EMTs often reflect on their service to their neighbors and community as a personally fulfilling and extremely rewarding experience.

We would like to thank all of our past and present members, both career and volunteer, because together they have created a foundation that we continue to build on. We miss those who have moved on and look forward to meeting new people who will help shape our future.

CT Prepares Web Application:

The CT Prepares app can be downloaded on both Apple and Android based smartphones. CT Prepares provides information and alerts in emergency situations and incorporates and integrates text messaging, email, and social networking, allowing residents to communicate with family members during an emergency. Users will receive real-time notifications including emergency news, state office closings, and public safety messages. CT Alert Notification System:






